Judge Executive, John L. Brent, led the Court in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

RE: PRAYER & PREPARATION

Silent prayer was observed in preparation for the meeting.

RE: CALL TO ORDER

Judge Brent called the meeting to order and noted everyone was present.

RE: APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Upon motion by Esq. Stanley and seconded by Esq. Timberlake, it is ordered by the Court to approve the minutes from the April 19, 2016 Regular Meeting and the minutes from the April 28, 2016 Special Budget Meeting.

RE: 2ND READING OF ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

Judge Brent reviewed the amendment to the Zoning Ordinance. Esq. Bates questioned if the section regarding signs included political signs. County Attorney, Virginia Harrod, reviewed the ordinance amendment. She noted it did not include political signs and she approved the amendment for the 2nd reading. Judge Brent noted he would like the Court to set some guidelines

for political and temporary signs. Esq. Bates agreed and noted he would like to see the guidelines include a time frame. Judge Brent noted many of the signs are placed on the right a ways. County Attorney Harrod noted the right a way is not private property and placing signs there would be criminal littering. Following discussion Judge Brent asked for a motion to approve.

3. Committee Report – Esq. Beasley

Esq. Beasley reported the Road Committee did meet regarding the slip on New Cut Road. Esq. Beasley complimented the road department for doing a good job cutting the trees out of the ditches on Happy Ridge.

RE: EMS/PARAMEDICS

1. Supervisor's Report

Judge Brent reported Henry County EMS Supervisor, Josh Jamiel, is not present as he is on a run. Judge Brent has been talking with Josh about managing his time and managing the schedule with the over-time. Josh is working on a schedule with 24 hour shifts to present to Judge Brent and the EMS Committee. Judge Brent stated he is open to looking at changes in the schedule.

2. Approval of Hiring Full-Time Paramedic

Esq. Bates noted the need to hire a full time paramedic. He brought recommendation that Brittany Ramsey be moved from part-time to full-time paramedic status.

Upon motion by Esq. Bates and seconded by Esq. Fisher, it is ordered by the Court that Brittany Ramsey be moved from part-time to full-time paramedic status.

Motion carried unanimously

3. Committee Report – Esq. Bates

Esq. Bates reported the Eminence EMS building is vacant. Esq. Bates complimented the previous renter noting she had a good daycare there, took care of everything and didn't bother anything. Travis is currently mowing the lot. The Committee hopes to find a renter to rent out the space where the daycare had been.

4. Tim Abrams to Address the Court

Henry County School Superintendent, Tim Abrams, asked to address the Court. Tim stressed he wanted to publicly thank the Henry County EMS, the Henry County Sheriff's Department, the Henry County Coroner, the New Castle Fire Department and Judge Diane Wheeler. They participated in the mock accident held at the Henry County High School. Tim noted all students from the Henry County High School and the juniors and seniors from the Eminence High School were present. Superintendent Abrams felt it had an impact on the 1100 students in attendance.

RE: P&Z/SOLID WASTE

1. Administrator's Report

Henry County P&Z/Solid Waste Administrator, Jody Rucker, reported 16 permits were issued last month with 5 of the permits for new houses. The Board of Adjustments met and passed 1 conditional use and 1 variance.

2. Electrical Inspections – General Discussion & Committee Request

Jody Rucker noted Esq. Stanley had been told most counties charge a fee for electrical permits and he suggested Henry County might want to do the same. This would go through the state

electrical inspector. Jody explained they would come to P&Z to get the electrical permit which would keep him informed of new electrical poles, etc. Jody asked our electrical inspector, Jerry Dunaway, his opinion and Mr. Dunaway thought it was a great ideal. Judge Brent suggested P&Z Committee members Esq. Fisher, Esq. Moffett and Esq. Timberlake meet before next month's meeting to discuss the issue and bring recommendation to the Court. Judge Brent also noted another issue has been with people living in lawn mower sheds. Judge Brent suggested the Committee may want to contact officials in Oldham County. They are having the same problem and they have been looking at the State guidelines.

3. Approval of Electrical Inspector's Contract

Judge Brent noted Jerry Dunaway has been working as our Electrical Inspector and he asked the Court to authorize him to enter into an official contract with Mr. Dunaway. Esq. Bates was very complimentary of the work Mr. Dunaway did for him personally.

Upon motion by Esq. Moffett and seconded by Esq. Bates, it is ordered by the Court to approve the Electrical Inspector's Contract with Jerry Dunaway.

RE: PARKS & FAIRGROUNDS

1. Superintendent's Report

Henry County Parks & Fairgrounds Superintendent, Travis Buchanan, reported the little league has one month left in their season. They have had a lot of rainouts. The two part-time summer helpers will be getting out of school next week. Travis reported the first of May a storm with high winds came through the fairgrounds. It damaged 2 sets of bleachers, light fixtures in the Ag Arena and the hail beat paint off several of the midway buildings. Travis noted a lot of painting will need to be done before the fair. Travis is waiting to hear back from the insurance adjuster on the damage. Travis noted they are busy with projects and mowing when they can.

2. Committee Report – Esq. Stanley

Esq. Stanley noted the Parks Committee did not meet.

RE: ANIMAL SERVICES

1. Director's Report

Judge Brent welcomed Henry County Animal Control Officer, Dan Flinkfelt, back following his accident. Dan reported with the spay and neuter program the shelter is down about 100 dogs from this time last year. The food Dan bought in December will last through this fiscal year. Dan felt he saved the County around \$3,000 by going to Lexington and purchasing the food. Dan complimented Skylar and Joan for picking up the slack while he was out. Dan also thanked the EMS, the Sheriff's Department and the New Castle Fire Department for coming to his rescue and helping him after his accident. Dan has a Dr. appointment next week to find out if he will require

surgery on his shoulder. The shelter will have a picnic on June 11th, to thank all the volunteers for helping at the shelter. Dan invited everyone to attend.

2. Committee Report – Esq. Fisher

Esq. Fisher noted the Animal Services Committee did not meet.

RE: EMA APPOINTMENTS – JODY RUCKER & MARTIN WASHBURN

Upon motion by Esq. Beasley and seconded by Esq. Fisher, it is ordered by the Court to re-appoint Jody Rucker as EMA Director and Martin Washburn as EMA Deputy Director.

RE: WINE SALE REQUEST AT FARMER'S MARKET & FAIRGROUNDS – MELISSA BLANKENSHIP

Judge Brent welcomed Melissa Blankenship, chairperson of the 2016 Henry County Harvest Showcase. Judge Brent asked Melissa if she wanted to address the Court. Melissa noted she sent some additional information in the packets for the Court to consider. She thanked the Court for their time. Judge Brent informed the Court that he spoke with Rich Ornstein, attorney with KACO Insurance. Mr. Ornstein reviewed the Fairgrounds Rental Contract and felt the Court would not be in conflict with the Contract by allowing the sale of unopened bottles of wine at the Harvest Showcase. Mr. Ornstein stressed going forward the Court needs to be careful not to pick and choose.

Upon motion by Esq. Moffett and seconded by Esq. Stanley, it is ordered by the Court to allow Smith-Berry Winery to sell unopened bottles of wine at the Henry County Harvest Showcase.

Judge Brent explained the County Road Aid. He held the County Road Aid Public Hearing. He asked for comments. There were no comments from the public.

RE: LGEA PUBLIC HEARING

Judge Brent explained the LGEA Fund and how the money is used. Judge Brent held the LGEA Public Hearing. He asked for comments. There were no comments from the public.

RE: LIBRARY APPOINTMENTS – DIANE BRAMMELL & THOMAS MINTON (LIBRARY RECOMMENDATIONS)

Upon motion by Esq. Bates and seconded by Esq. Timberlake, it is ordered by the Court to accept the recommendations from the Library and reappoint Diane Brammell and Thomas Minton to the Library Board.

Motion carried unanimously

RE: HORSE COUNCIL-TOM JACKSON TO ADDRESS THE COURT

Mr. Tom Jackson came before the Court to discuss a problem that is occurring in his neighborhood. He explained a neighbor's horses run loose getting on his property and in the road. Mr. Jackson expressed concerns that an accident was going to happen. He noted Henry County does not have an organization to take care of horses. He would like to get a group of horsemen and cattlemen with equipment and knowledge to rescue the horses when there is a problem. Dan Flinkfelt noted he is aware of the issues and has been talking with a lady from Oldham County who has equipment and space for the horses. Dan stressed there are no horse laws on the books. County Attorney, Virginia Harrod, stated the State has a statue which gives the Sheriff the authority to round up the horses and to appoint special deputies with equipment. Judge Brent noted the issue with the horses is not abuse. The lady refuses to fix her fence and the horses are out all the time. Dan volunteered to meet with Mr. Jackson and the Animal Services Committee to discuss the issue.

Mr. David Trimble came before the Court to express his concerns with speeders on Sweeney Lane. He offered to pave or gravel an area for the Sheriff's department to park on his property to catch the speeders. Mr. Trimble noted he has called the State Police, but had no response. Esq. Moffett volunteered to contact the State Police and get some patrols on Sweeney.

RE: COURT COMMENTS

Esq. Fisher noted in Judge Brent's update to the Court he stated the State is moving slower than normal and he feels no rural secondary paving will happen until 2017. Esq. Fisher questioned if the flex funds could be returned to the County if the State is not going to use them. Judge Brent noted these projects will bid in September with a completion date of May or June. Esq. Fisher and Judge Brent were in agreement we might get a better blacktop job in the Spring.

Judge Brent, Esq. Moffett, Rep. Rick Rand and Sen. Paul Hornback will meet with the Department of Transportation next Tuesday, to discuss the Eminence Project and Hwy 146.
